

Welcome Message By ATAA President

Dear Friends,

Warm greetings and welcome to the 23rd Annual Convention of the Assembly of Turkish American Associations.

We are holding this convention as Turkey stands at the threshold of historic opportunities and challenges. A new government has been formed by the Justice and Development Party (AKP) that for the first time in many years will govern the country on its own. Turkey's EU membership prospects will reach an important milestone with the Copenhagen Summit; negotiations have reached a critical momentum on Cyprus with a new UN settlement plan proposed to the two sides for negotiations; global and regional foreign policy challenges, in the form of Turkey's role in the war against terrorism and future international action regarding Iraq, are augmented by ongoing efforts to salvage the losses from the worst economic crisis in Turkey's modern history. Monumental changes have taken place in Turkey's constitutional, legal, social and political order that may yet be followed by other groundbreaking reforms in compliance with the wishes of the Turkish people, such as election law and political party law reforms, that will open the way for more representative and transparent governance. This is the backdrop against which we have gathered, and we will try to address some of these crucial issues here during our convention.

In my last Convention as President of the Assembly, I would also like to take this opportunity to review the past two years and what we have accomplished as ATAA.

During my tenure, we set out to undertake a major expansion in our national outreach and worked to increase the visibility of ATAA, both in the United States and in Turkey. I believe that in great part we have achieved this goal.

Building upon the work of past ATAA leadership, we worked to increase the profile of the Assembly in Washington DC and across the country. Despite the fact that 2001 and 2002 were marred by a terrible attack on our country on September 11 and an ensuing economic downturn both in the United States and in Turkey, we strived to undertake the many activities we set out to do. The war against terrorism brought special spotlight on Turkey and our community rose to the challenge to help ATAA to reap benefits for Turkey out of this renewed interest. We worked hard to increase individual ATAA members, while strengthening our relations with ATAA component associations around the country. The appeal of ATAA as the national umbrella organization of the Turkish American community remained strong, as three new Turkish American associations applied to join ATAA at this convention, which will bring the number of ATAA member associations to 57.

I had also pledged to help ATAA be even more an organization of the community, not a body entrenched in Washington DC, out of touch with its members and supporters. During my term, our Board decided to implement a series of nationwide Grassroots/Leadership conferences for our community. The result were a series of events in Houston, New York, Atlanta, Detroit, Monterey, Boston, Chicago, Philadelphia, and Seattle. These road shows were designed to learn more about the interests and needs of different local communities and answer the questions of specific groups of



local activists. Each event was customized according to the preferences of the local ATAA component association and our regional Vice Presidents and were designed to provide participants with information and know-how to help them become more successful and focused in their work. Nearly one thousand members of our community participated in these seminars and activities around them, strengthening the national grassroots outreach of the Assembly and increasing advocacy efforts of the Turkish American community. To further solidify the national presence of ATAA, I believe in the long-term benefit of opening ATAA regional chapters in at least 3-4 locations with large Turkish American local communities and hope that ATAA can undertake this important step in the near future.

In line with our efforts to provide the Turkish American community's input to policy making in Ankara and to educate the ATAA leadership on issues of importance to the United States and to Turkey, we organized two trips to Turkey during my tenure. In 2001, we visited Ankara and extended our visit to South/Southeast Turkey, visiting lands that have been continuously inhabited for over 7,000 years, rich not only in history, but also in a living culture of different religions and ethnicities. During this journey we discovered the many different faces of Turkey and gained a better understanding of the issues that affect this region and Turkey, while witnessing its enormous potential. In 2002, after our visit to Ankara, we traveled on to Bulgaria, an important neighbor of Turkey with which it shares a long history and that is home to a large Turkish community. Through our many meetings with Bulgarian officials, including those of Turkish descent, we saw the transformation of the Bulgarian Turkish minority into a vibrant partner in the country's government and in its future. I am also happy to report that many recommendations made by ATAA delegations during our visits to Ankara were brought to fruition, one of them being a visit by 39 Turkish American youths to Turkey, which we hope will continue as an annual program.

On the legislative front, the past year has been a good one for both Turkey and the Turkish American community, reflective of the increasing importance of Turkey for the United States and globally. 2002 has seen an unprecedented number of resolutions and legislation pass the United States Congress in support of US-Turkish relations and Turkey. ATAA provided leadership and guidance to members of our community in support of these measures. Another indication of growing awareness about Turkey in Congress and the contributions to this extend of our community was the significant increase in membership of the Caucus on US-Turkish Relations and Turkish Americans.



Founded in 1979, the mission of the Assembly of **Turkish American** Associations (ATAA) is to unite to the fast growing community of Turkish Americans, friends of Turkey and their associations throughout the United States; preserve and protect the identity of the **Turkish American** community and build bridges between the American and Turkish people.

ATAA was co-founded by the American Turkish Association of Washington and the Maryland American Turkish Association in an effort to create a national organization representing the Turkish American community. The first meeting of the ATAA General Assembly was held in May of 1980 in Washington. Delegates from 26 organizations participated and created a coordination committee to write the constitution and bylaws. The bylaws of ATAA were ratified on November 16, 1980 and the first board of ATAA elected.

From this nucleus, the Assembly has grown into an organization that represents 54 Turkish American organizations in the United States, Canada and Turkey. Today, the Assembly is an influential and fast growing civic organization that pursues the interests of Turkish Americans and friends of Turkey in Washington and beyond, as well as contributes to the strengthening of relations between the United States and Turkey.

A growing base of individual ATAA members support the work of the Assembly through dues and donations. Financial assistance to the operations of ATAA is also granted from the ATAA Endowment Fund established to secure the long-term growth of the organization.

To fulfill its mission and objectives, ATAA undertakes a number of activities, such as educational seminars for Turkish American communities on grassroots advocacy and civic leadership; conferences on contemporary political, social and economic issues related to Turkey and US-Turkish relations; and cultural events to promote Turkey's rich traditions, art and heritage. Working as an information clearinghouse, ATAA regularly publishes reference material on issues that concern the Turkish American community. The Assembly is also the publisher of a bi-weekly newspaper since 1989, The Turkish Times. ATAA hosts one of the most dynamic website on Turkey and maintains an extensive E-mail communication network. For more information on the daily work of ATAA, visit www. ataa.org.

Keynote Speakers

Ali Babacan

Mr. Babacan was born in 1967 in Ankara. Marc Grossman

Ambassador Marc Grossman was confirmed by the U.S. Senate on March 23, 2001 and sworn in as Under Secretary for Political Affairs on March 26, 2001. Ambassador Grossman has been a career Foreign Service Officer since 1976. He was Director General of the Foreign Service and Director of Human Resources, from June 2000 to February 2001, and Assistant Secretary of State for European Affairs, from August 1997 to May 2000. From November 1994 to June 1997, he served as U.S. Ambassador to Turkey. Prior to this, from January 1993 to September 1994, he was Special Assistant to the Secretary of State and Executive Secretary of the Department of State. Before assuming these duties, Ambassador Grossman served as Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Political Military Affairs. He was Executive Assistant to Deputy Secretary of State John C. Whitehead, from September 1986 to January 1989. From 1984 to 1986, Ambassador Grossman was the Deputy Director of the Private Office of Lord Carrington, then Secretary General of NATO. Other overseas assignments include tours as a political officer at the U.S Mission to NATO and in Islamabad. In Washington, DC he also has served as Deputy Special Adviser to President Carter and in several capacities for the Bureau of Near Eastern and South Asian Affairs. Ambassador Grossman earned a B.A. from the University of California, Santa Barbara and a MSc. in International Relations from the London School of Economics and Political Science.

O. Faruk Loğoğlu

Dr. O. Faruk Loğoğlu is currently the Ambassador of the Republic of Turkey to US. He joined the Turkish Diplomatic Service in 1971, and served in a variety of positions in Ankara and in the Turkish missions abroad. His first ambassadorial assignment was in Denmark from 1993 to 1996. Later, he served as Turkey's ambassador to Azerbaijan from 1996 to 1998. He served as Undersecretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs between 2000- 2001. After graduating from Tarsus American College in Tarsus in 1960, Dr. Loğoğlu obtained a B.A. in Political Science from Brandeis University in Boston, and his MA and Ph.D. degrees in Political Science from Princeton University.

Robert Wexler

Congressman Robert Wexler (D-19th/FL) will be serving his fourth term in the US House of Representatives. Congressman Wexler, who previously served in the Florida Senate for six years, currently represents Florida's 19th Congressional district, comprising portions of Broward and Palm Beach Counties. Osman Bengür

Osman Bengür was born in Montgomery County, Maryland 1949. His accomplishments in working with disadvantaged children lead to his role in helping reform foster care in the Department of Children and Family Services in Illinois. Ilan Berman

Professor Ilan Berman is Vice President for Policy at the American Foreign Policy Council in Washington, DC, and Director of the Council's Eurasia Program. An expert on international terrorism and regional security in the Middle East, Central Asia and the Russian Federation, Mr. Berman's writings have appeared in such publications as the Wall Street Journal Europe, Middle East Quarterly, the Washington Times, United Press International, the Jerusalem Post, the Journal of International Security Affairs and Strategic Review. A frequent guest on radio and television, Mr. Berman has provided expert commentary for Fox News, the BBC, Voice of America and Radio Liberty, as well as the Agence France Presse news service, U.S. News & World Report and Insight on the News. Born in 1954 in Istanbul, Mr. Cengizer is a graduate of TED Ankara College and Bosphorus University. He also holds a Master of Arts degree in International History from London School of Economics. Mr. Cengizer's previous postings abroad include Kuwait, London and Brussels. In Brussels he served as political counselor at Turkey's Permanent Representation to the European Union at a time when the important Maastricht Summit was convened and Turkey completed the negotiations for the establishment of the Customs Union with the European Union. On his return from Brussels in 1994, Mr. Cengizer was appointed as Deputy Chief of Staff and Advisor on Foreign Affairs to then President Süleyman Demirel. His major trade policy focuses include issues such as fast-track trade negotiating authority, the Free Trade Area of the Americas, WTO negotiations and China policy in the wake of WTO membership. He is the only think-tank professional to be writing on the U.S.-Turkish economic relationship Mr. Gresser joined PPI following ten years of service in the Clinton Administration and Congress. As Policy Advisor to U.S. Trade Representative, Charlene Barshefsky from April 1998 through the close of the Clinton Administration, Mr. Gresser twice received USTR's prestigious Special Achievement award. Earlier, he served as Legislative Assistant and then Policy Director for Senator Max Baucus (D-MT). Before joining Baucus' staff, He had worked for the consulting firm Podesta Associates, and as a Legislative Assistant for Congressman Silvio Conte



of Massachusetts. He graduated from Stanford University with Distinction in Political Science in 1984. He earned a Master's Degree in International Affairs from Columbia University and a certificate from the Harriman Institute for Advanced Study of the Soviet Union in 1987, writing a thesis focusing on political relations between the Soviet Union and Southeast Asia.

Douglas Hengel

Douglas Hengel joined the Foreign Service in 1978 and has served at the U.S. Embassies in Caracas (1979-81), Rome (1984-88), Lima (1991-93) and Prague (1994-97), in addition to various positions in the State Department in the Bureau of European Affairs, the Bureau of Western Hemisphere Affairs and the Bureau of Economic and Business Affairs. From 1999-2002 Mr. Hengel was Deputy Chief of Mission in Bratislava, serving more than half of that period as Charge d'Affaires. He currently is Director of the Office of Southern European Affairs at the State Department, responsible for Turkey, Greece and Cyprus. A native of New York State, Mr. Hengel studied at Colgate University (BA, 1976). He obtained a Masters in Public Policy at the Woodrow Wilson School at Princeton University in 1998. Prior to beginning his diplomatic career, Mr. Hengel worked for the Union Carbide Corporation in New York. Mr. Hengel is married and has two children, aged 14 and 11.

Ömer Kanat

Ömer Kanat was born in 1961 in East Turkistan. He graduated from the Department of history of Istanbul University and for many years worked as a journalist for Radio Liberty in Munich . He is one of the founders of the East Turkistan Union in Europe and served as General Secretary , Vice President and later as President of the organization. He is one of the founders of the World Uyghur Youth Congress and served as its President between 1996-2000. Now he serves as the General Secretary of the East Turkistan National Congress and vice- president of the Uyghur-American Association.

Attila Karaosmanoğlu

Dr. Attila Karaosmanoğlu is an economist by profession. He was educated at the University of Ankara and Istanbul. He was a visiting scholar at Harvard and Exchange Faculty. He is a member of NYU's Faculty. He also attended Ankara and Middle East Technical Universities between 1954-63. In his professional life, he was Head of the Economic Planning Department of the State Planning Org. of Turkey, Adviser to the Federation of Turkish Trade Unions, Consultant to the Turkish Scientific and Tech. Research Council, Senior Consultant Directorate for Scientific Affairs OECD, an Economist at the World Bank, Deputy Prime Minister of Turkey in 1971 in charge of Economic Affairs and Chairman of the High Planning Council. He has also been the World Bank's Chief Economist for European, Middle East, and North Africa Region, Director of Europe, Middle East and North Africa Region Country Programs, Vice President East Asia and Pacific Regions, Vice President of the Asia Region and between 1991-1994 he was appointed as the Managing Director of the World Bank. Presently he is a Board Member of the Turkish Scientific and Technical. Research Council. His Publications include Towards Full Employment and Price Stability (OECD Pub. with others) 1977, Poverty and Prosperity- The two Realities of Asian Development (World Bank Pub.) 1989; Diversity and Consensus- The Emergence of an Asian Development Paradigm (World Bank Pub) 1991, 21. Richard D. Kauzlarich

Ambassador (ret) Richard D. Kauzlarich has been Director of the Special Initiative on the Muslim World at the US Institute of Peace since February, 2002. Previously, he was a consultant in the Washington DC area working on peacekeeping operations in the Balkans, energy, and development issues in the Caucasus and the Balkans. A former career Foreign Service Officer, he served as US Ambassador to Bosnia and Herzegovina (1997-1999), and Azerbaijan (1994-1997.) He was Senior Deputy to the Secretary's and the President's Special Representative to the Newly Independent States (NIS) from 1993-1994. He was Deputy Assistant Secretary of State in the Bureau of European Affairs (1991-1993) responsible for relations with the former Soviet Union and economic ties with EU and OECD countries. Ambassador Kauzlarich has also served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for International Organization Affairs (1984-1986) where he was in charge of the technical and specialized agencies



of the United Nations. He was also Deputy Director of the Policy Planning Staff (1986-1989) handled global and international economic issues. Abroad, in addition to his ambassadorial assignments, he served at American Embassies in Togo, Ethiopia, and Israel. In December 2001, The Century Foundation published his report "Time for Change? U.S. Policy in the Transcaucasus." Kauzlarich received his BA from Valparaiso University and MAs from Indiana University and the University of Michigan.

Orhan Ketene

Mr. Orhan Ketene was born in Kerkük, Iraq. He graduated from Al-Markaziyya high school in Baghdad in 1971 and from the Technical University of Istanbul, Turkey, as an aerospace engineer in 1977. For 22 years he has worked as a design, chief engineering specialist and liaison engineer in the automotive and aerospace industries in Turkey, Canada and USA. He has been active in Iraqi Turkmen politics since 1969 and is the US Representative for the Iraqi Turkmen Front in Washington, DC. He has published in various publications.

Ercüment Kılıç

Mr. Kılıç was born in 1958 in Ankara. He is a graduate of UT-Austin with a BS in Economics and International Politics. He has served numerous times as President of TURANT and as VP of ATAA. Among his accomplishments is his involvement and arrangement of Congressman Jim Moody's trip as the first US Congressman in history to visit Azerbaijan. Due to his formal training in performing arts, he has been a cultural ambassador for Turkey since 1977. He has been invited by various organizations to do seminars and workshops on Turkish folklore in all 50 states in the US and in England, Germany, Holland, Switzerland, the Republic of China, Hong Kong, and Japan. He is currently involved with his own business, TCI Travel and TCI Construction. He currently serves as ATAA Treasurer.

James Kitfield

Mr. James Kitfield is presently the national security and foreign affairs correspondent for National Journal magazine, an independent and non-partisan newsweekly on politics and government published by National Journal Inc. He has written on defense, national security and

foreign policy issues from Washington, D.C. for more than fifteen years, previously as a defense correspondent and senior editor of Government Executive and Military Forum magazines. Mr. Kitfield is also the author of "Prodigal Soldiers," (How the Generation of Officers Born of Vietnam Revolutionized the American Style of War). Before moving to Washington, D.C. Kitfield observed the U.S. military in Europe as managing editor of Overseas! magazine, a publication for U.S. service members stationed overseas. His articles have appeared in Omni, Newsday, National Journal, Penthouse, Los Angeles Magazine, Army Times, Air Force Magazine, The Stars & Stripes, Off Duty, The National Interest, and other publications. Emre Kongar

Professor Emre Kongar graduated from the Faculty of Political Sciences of Ankara University, majoring in Economics. He received his M.S.W from the School of Social Work of the University of Michigan. He did his Ph.D. in Sociology at Hacettepe University, with his thesis on Urban Family Structure in İzmir. He became a Full Professor in 1981. He was Undersecretary of the Ministry of Culture between 1992-1995. He was reappointed as a Professor of Sociology at Hacettepe University in 1996. Michael A. Ledeen

Mr. Michael A. Ledeen is a resident scholar in the Freedom Chair at AEI. An expert in contemporary history and international affairs, Mr. Ledeen contributes frequently to the Wall Street Journal, the Weekly Standard, National Review, and Commentary and serves as a foreign editor of the American Spectator. During the Reagan administration, he was a consultant to the national security adviser, the Office of the Secretary of Defense, and the State Department and was a special adviser to the Secretary of State. He is the author of twelve books, including Grave New World (Oxford University Press, 1985), which predicted the crisis in the Soviet Union five years before it occurred; Freedom Betrayed: How the United States Led a Global Democratic Revolution, Won the Cold War, and Walked Away (AEI Press, 1996); Machiavelli on Modern Leadership (St. Martin's Press, 1999); Tocqueville on American Character (St. Martin's Press, 2000); and The War Against the Terror Masters, which has just been published by St. Martin's Press.

David Loevinger

David Loevinger is the Acting Deputy Assistant Treasury Secretary fo Africa, Middle East and Asia, reporting to the Assistant and Under Secretary for International Affairs. Loevinger advises on U.S. policy regarding the International Monetary Fund, World Bank, and regional development banks, and represents Treasury in bilateral and multilateral meetings. His earlier positions at Treasury (he first joined in 1991 as a staff economist) included Special Assistant to the Under Secretary, Assistant Attaché in Paris, Economist on the Mexico Crisis Task Force, and Director of the Office of East Asian Nations. In 1995-1999, Loevinger worked at the IMF, first in the U.S. Executive Director's office and then as an economist in the Carribbean Division. Loevinger received a B.A. from Dartmouth College in 1984. In 1988, he completed a Master's in Public Policy from the Kennedy School and then spent three years working for the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative, the Senate Banking Committee, and the U.S. Commerce Department. He is married with two children.

Alan O. Makovsky

Alan O. Makovsky is currently a Senior Staff member of the Democratic professional staff of the House International Relations Committee. Prior to this he was a Fellow at The Washington Institute for Near East Policy, specializing on Middle Eastern and Turkish affairs, and heading the Institute's Turkish Research Program. He served for eleven years in the U.S. Department of State, in a variety of capacities mainly focusing on the Middle East and Turkey. Most recently, he worked as Special Advisor to Special Middle East Coordinator Dennis Ross in 1993 until his departure in May 1994. In 1992, he served as State Department liaison officer and political advisor to Operation Provide Comfort. His other positions included analyst for Turkish and Greek affairs (1983-85), analyst for Palestinian affairs and the Middle East peace process (1985-88), and division chief for Southern Europe in the State Department's Bureau of Intelligence and Research. Mr. Makovsky holds a B.A., from Princeton University in Near Eastern Studies (1973) and M.A.'s from the University of Michigan in History (1975) and Princeton University in Near Eastern Studies (1977). His focus in graduate school was on both the history of the Ottoman Empire and the history of the modern Arab world, and he received a Fulbright Fellowship to conduct research in Turkey, Egypt, and Israel in 1978-79. Mr. Makovsky is conversant in three Middle Eastern languages, Arabic, Hebrew, and Turkish.

Justin McCarthy

Justin McCarthy received a Ph.D. in Near Eastern history from UCLA in 1978 and a Certificate in Demography from Princeton University in 1980. He is presently Distinguished Professor of Arts and Sciences at the University of Louisville, where he also served as Chairman of the Department of History from 1986 to 1992. He has been a Visiting Fellow at Princeton University, the School of Oriental and African Studies of the University of London, and Boğaziçi University in İstanbul. From 1967 to 1969 he taught at Middle East Technical University in Ankara as a US Peace Corps Volunteer. Professor McCarthy specializes in the social and demographic history of the modern Middle East. His books include Muslims and Minorities, a study of population of Ottoman Anatolia in the period of World War I, Death and Exile, on the expulsion and mortality



of the Muslims of the Balkans, Caucasus, Crimea, and Anatolia, The Population of Palestine, and a textbook, The Ottoman Turks. He has written a number of articles on Middle Eastern, Turkish, and Ottoman topics. He has also contributed to or has written teachers' manuals. He frequently addresses academic and public audiences in the United States, Europe, and Middle East. Professor McCarthy has been voted a Corresponding Member of the Turkish Historical Association. He has received the Chairman's Education Award from the Turkish-American Friendship Council and awards from Turkish-American organizations. In 1985 he received an honorary doctorate from Boğaziçi University. He has held a Senior Research Fellowship from the National Needs Postdoctoral Fellowship from the National Science Foundation, a Fulbright-Hays fellowship, and other fellowships and grants

G. Lincoln McCurdy

Mr. McCurdy is the president of the American-Turkish Council (ATC), one of the most dynamic bi-national trade associations in Washington, DC. ATC is a nonfor-profit trade association with over 200 corporate members and is the leading business association in the United States devoted to the promotion of U.S.-Turkish commercial, defense and cultural relations. He has been affiliated with the organization since 1989 and has previously served in the capacity of Senior Vice President and Executive Director. Mr. McCurdy has over twenty years of experience in both U.S. government service and the private sector, particularly working in developing countries in the promotion of trade, foreign investment and tourism. He was one of the principle organizers of the first U.S. - Turkish Trade and Investment Mission to the newly independent states in Central Asia and the Caucasus in Spring 1992. Before joining ATC, Mr. McCurdy was with the U.S. Department of Commerce and served in the American Consulate General in Istanbul as the Consul for Commercial Affairs. He also worked in Istanbul as an international marketing consultant. G. Lincoln McCurdy received his B.A. at Hanover College in Indiana and holds a M.A. in International Management from The George Washington University. He is also a graduate of the Foreign Service Institute's Turkish Language and Culture Program.

Onur Öymen

Amb. (ret) Onur Öymen is Member of Parliament as a Deputy for the Republican Peoples' Party. He graduated from Galatasaray Lycee and the Political Sciences Faculty of Ankara University, where he also received his Ph.D. In 1964 he joined the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and his positions include: Deputy Permanent Representative, Turkish Delegation to the Council of Europe, Strasbourg; Counsellor, Turkish Embassy, Nicosia, Prague and Madrid; Head of the Policy Planning Department, Ambassador to Denmark and Germany; Undersecretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Permanent Representative to NATO in Brussels. In 1995 he was awarded the Civil Servant of the Year Award by Nokta Magazine and in 1995,1996 and 1997 Diplomat of the Year by the Turkish Industrialists' and Businessmen's Association. His publications include "Turkey's Challenge" and "Geleceği Yakalamak: Küreselleşme ve Devlet Reformu". He is married with two children.

Mark R. Parris

Ambassador (ret) Mark R. Parris is Senior Foreign Policy Advisor with the Washington law firm of Baker, Donelson, Bearman & Caldwell. He served as U.S. Ambassador to Turkey from 1997-2000, a period of broad-gauged growth in U.S. - Turkish relations, culminating in President Clinton's designation of Turkey as a "strategic partner" of the United States. From 1989-1997, Ambassador Parris played a key role in the development and implementation of U.S. Middle East policy. As Deputy Chief of Mission in Tel Aviv he witnessed the first intifada, the Gulf War, and the Madrid Peace Conference. As Principal Deputy Assistant of State for Near East Affairs and then Special Assistant to the President and Senior Advisor for Near East and South Asian affairs, he oversaw U.S. policy toward Iraq and Iran and participated in high-level peace negotiations between Israel and its Arab neighbors. Ambassador Parris was Director of Soviet Affairs during President Ronald Reagan's second term, organizing and serving as notetaker for President Reagan's first four summit meetings with Mikhail Gorbachev. The Ambassador's earlier assignments included Moscow, Lisbon and the Azores. Since retiring from the Foreign Service in 2001 with the personal rank of Career Minister, Ambassador Parris has served as Chairman of the Board of the American Friends



of Turkey, and as a member of the Executive Board of the American Turkish Council. He is Counselor to the Turkish Research Program of the Washington Institute for Near East Policy.

Robert Pearson

Ambassador W. Robert Pearson, of Tennessee, a Career Member of the Senior Foreign Service, Class of Minister-Counselor, has a broad background in European and Security issues as well as wide management experience overseas and in Washington. The Senate confirmed Ambassador Pearson as Ambassador to Turkey on July 9, 2000. He officially assumed his position in Ankara on September 21, 2000. Ambassador Pearson was Deputy Chief of Mission of the U.S. Embassy to France from July 1997 to July 2000. He followed closely the evolution of European Union policy regarding the candidacy of Turkey for membership, and defense and security issues within the Atlantic Alliance and the EU. He actively promoted business ties between France and the U.S. and helped in the opening of five new offices in France s regions. He served twice at NATO, from 1993 to 1997 as Deputy Permanent Representative to the U.S. Mission during the Balkan crisis and NATO s enlargement, and from 1987 to 1990 on the international staff as Chair of NATO's Political Committee. From 1991 to 1993, he was the Executive Secretary of the Department of State. He served as Deputy Executive Secretary of the National Security Council (1985-1987). He served in Beijing, China as a political officer (1981 to 1983), was staff assistant in the East and Pacific Affairs bureau, and began his Foreign Service career with a two-year assignment in Auckland, New Zealand (1976-1978). Ambassador Pearson served in the U.S. Navy Judge Advocate General's Corps from 1969 to 1973, and is a graduate of the University of Virginia Law School in 1968. He is a member of the International Institute for Strategic Studies in London. He speaks French and Chinese. His wife, Margaret, is a career diplomat. The Pearsons have one son, Matthew.

Stephen Schwartz

Stephen Schwartz is a Senior Policy Analyst for the Foundation for the Defense of Democracies in Washington, DC and has pursued a long literary and journalistic career. He was a staff writer for San Francisco Chronicle for 10 years and was secretary of the Northern California Newspaper Guild, AFL- CIO. His articles have appeared in most of the world's leading newspapers including The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal, the Los Angeles Times, The Daily Telegraph of London and many more. He is a regular contributor to The Weekly Standard as well as to Reforma in Mexico City and leading periodicals in the Balkans. He began a serious study of Islam in 1990, when he first visited Yugoslavia. Researching the history of Jews in the Balkans for articles published in the Jewish Forward and other periodicals he developed close relations with Balkan Islamic intellectual, religious and political leaders. In 2000, he published a book in Bosnian and English on Muslim identity and media issues in the Balkans, "A Dishonest 20th Century Comedy" (Forum of the Congress of Bosnian Muslim Intellectuals, Sarajevo.) He also published a volume in Britain on the Kosovo war. His many publications include Religion in Kosovo, International Crisis Group, Brussels/ Washington/Kosovo, 2001; Kosovo: Background to a War, Anthem Press, London, 2000, introduction by Christopher Hitchens; From West to East: and California and the Making of the American Mind, New York, The Free Press, Inc., 1998.

Mümtaz Soysal

Professor Mümtaz Soysal is a Professor of constitutional law and comparative government at Ankara University. He is President of the Center for the Development of Public Enterprise (KIGEM) and a Constitutional Adviser to the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus. He did his Undergraduate and doctoral studies at Ankara University and his Graduate research at the London School of Economics, Princeton and California (Berkeley) Universities. He has been a member of the Constituent Assembly (1961), a member and Vice-Chairman of the International Executive Committee of Amnesty International. He was Member of Parliament between 1991-1998 and served as Minister of Foreign Affairs in 1994. His awards include First International UNESCO Prize for the Teaching of Human Rights (Paris, 1998); Distinguished Service Award, Ministry of Foreign Affairs (Ankara, 1990) and Officer de L'Ordre National de Mérite (France, 1991). He has published widely mainly on constitutional law, government and politics.



Haluk Şahin

Prof. Dr. Haluk Şahin is recognized as one of Turkey's leading media figures, both as a practitioner of journalism and a communications scholar. He currently teaches at Istanbul Bilgi University as a Professor of Journalism in addition to writing a column for Turkey's prestige daily, Radikal, and producing a weekly discussion program for TV8. Şahin graduated from Istanbul University, Faculty of Law in 1964 before receiving a Masters Degree in Journalism (1972) and a Doctorate in Mass Communications (1974) from Indiana University. Ever since, he has pursued a double-track career as a practicing journalist and a teacher of mass communications. Sahin has won many professional awards for his journalistic work both as a print journalist and as a television editor and producer. Twice the Turkish Association of Journalists chose him Journalist of the Year for Best Commentary. He won two international investigative journalism awards in connection with his work with Arena, once Turkey's leading television news program. Sahin has published 10 books. He also has an extensive record of academic publications both at home and abroad. Şahin was president of the Turkish Foreign Press Association, also president of the Turkish Communication Research Association (ILAD), and secretary general of the Turkish Press Council. Currently, he is a member of the Turkish Journalists' Association, International Press Institute, and vice-president of the Troyan Art Society.

Tunku Varadarajan

Mr. Tunku Varadarajan is the Wall Street's Journals Editorial Features Editor. He is responsible for soliciting, selecting and editing the Journal's daily-oped features. He joined the Journal in June 2000 as a senior editorial page writer and later that year became deputy editorial features editor. Earlier this year he assumed the added responsibility of chief media critic. He has been an editorial writer and Madrid and New York bureau chief for the London Times. He is an Oxford graduate.

R. James Woolsey

R. James Woolsey joined Booz Allen Hamilton in July 2002, as a Vice President and officer in the firm's Global Strategic Security practice located in McLean, VA. During the twelve years he has served in the U.S. Government Mr. Woolsey has held Presidential

appointments in two Democratic and two Republican administrations. He was Director of Central Intelligence in 1993-95. He also served as: Ambassador to the Negotiation on Conventional Armed Forces in Europe Vienna, 1989-1991; Under Secretary of the Navy, 1977-1979; and General Counsel to the U.S. Senate Committee on Armed Services, 1970-73. He was appointed by the President as Delegate at Large to the U.S.-Soviet Strategic Arms Reduction Talks and Nuclear and Space Arms Talks and served in that capacity on a part-time basis in Geneva, 1983-1986. As an officer in the U.S. Army he was an adviser on the U.S. Delegation to the Strategic Arms Limitation Talks, Helsinki and Vienna, 1969-1970. Mr. Woolsey has been a Director or Trustee of numerous civic organizations, including The Smithsonian Institution, The Goldwater Scholarship Foundation, and The Aerospace Corporation. He received his B.A. Degree in 1963 from Stanford University an M.A. from Oxford University, where he was a Rhodes Scholar 1963-65, and an LL.B from Yale Law School in 1968, where he was Managing Editor of the Yale Law Journal.

The Textile Museum in Washington DC has made major contributions to enhancing US-Turkish ties by bringing Turkish art, history and culture to Americans through its high quality exhibitions and other educational activities. The latest exhibit organized and currently on display at the Museum, The Classical Tradition in Anatolian Carpets, has created wonderful publicity for this centuries old art form of Turkey.

ATAA Distinguished Service Award

Dr. Sevinç Balımtaş from Maryland is a volunteer leader who has served the Turkish American community and women in Maryland for a long number of years, and has made outstanding contributions to building schools in needy villages and small towns in Turkey while serving as president of the Washington Turkish Women's Association.

John and Peggy Blake from California are the flag bearers of the Pleasant Hill, CA -Merzifon Sister City program. They shouldered prejudice and propaganda from those who wanted to prevent this cultural exchange between the US and Turkey. Now, they are working on establishing an endowment for these kinds of programs.



Barbara Sher from New York is a best-selling author who is also running a very successful team workshop. She picked a small town in Ürgüp, Turkey, to implement her "Kilim Women" project. As part of this endeavor she has been motivating the local village women to regain their weaving skills and to learn how to use computers in order to be able to direct market their products worldwide through the Internet.

Osman Tat has served the ATAA with distinction as Assistant Director for Public Affairs since July 1999. In this capacity, he advanced the Assembly's grassroots advocacy program, managed its public affairs portfolio and relations with ATAA component associations. He is leaving the Assembly to join US Foreign Service as a career diplomat.

Ahmet Toprak from California is a community service veteran. He is the founder of Turkish radio broadcasts in the Bay Area, and started them in 1982 collaboration with two other Turkish Americans. Since then, the Turkish radio program has been on the air every weekend. He also hosts the Orient Express, another weekly program on the culture of the Turkish world on KKUP.

Mine Tuncak from Washington is a Rotary Club member who was able to initiate a major fund raising campaign during the earthquake relief efforts that turned into a project of equipping a rehabilitation center in Istanbul.

Nurten Ural from Michigan is a long time community activist and the current Vice-President of ATAA's Midcentral Region. She is a community leader par excellence and has worked diligently to promote the profile of the Turkish American community in her area and has stood up against defamatory actions against Turks.

ATAA Outstanding Achievement in Arts & Humanities Award

Ahmet Lüleci from Massachusetts has dedicated most of his life to research, perform and promote various areas of Turkish folk arts, especially Turkish folk dances. Over the years, he has worked with numerous international groups, teaching and performing Turkish folk dances in the United States and all over the world. He is recognized for his accomplishments for bringing Turkish culture and folk art to international and American audiences and artists and for his long time community service.

Armağan Selçik is an architect and Vice President of R. Bratti & Associates of Virginia and spearheaded his company to be part of the Pentagon Phoenix Project after 9/11, to help the healing process of the whole nation. He inspired his workers to finish replacing the damaged limestone wall five months ahead of schedule by spending countless hours at the crash site.

ATAA Outstanding Achievement in Science Award

Dr. Orhan Nalcioğlu has made many outstanding contributions to the field of Medicine. He is currently the Director of Health Sciences Research Imaging Center at University of California, Irvine's College of Medicine. Since 1975 his research has been in the development of medical imaging systems and image based measurement techniques for medical research and patient healthcare. He has published a large number of papers in addition to co-authoring/ editing several books on medical imaging. He has trained a great number of students and postgraduate researchers many of whom are now established researchers in the field of medical imaging in their own right.

ATAA Meritorious Service Award

Başak Brown from Missouri is a hard working community volunteer and always ready to bring ideas to community activism. She has a history of introducing the Turkish culture to diverse groups of people, widening the circle of American friends of Turkey.



İsmail Hakkı Ercan from Florida has been a long time community volunteer, serving as president of the Florida Turkish American Association. His has made valuable contributions to the promotion of Turkish culture and image in his region.

Feriha Istar from Maryland has been a leading member of the Turkish American community for a great many years. She has not only led local Associations but has supported the many Turkish American groups in Washington DC. Her enthusiasm for her community and her deep involvement in Washington area activities has made her an irreplaceable force, a force of experience, practical knowledge and know-how.

She has made outstanding contributions to the promotion of Turkish culture, art and archeology through her leadership role in many projects, including the endowment of the Kanuni Suleyman Professorship of Ottoman and Modern Turkish Studies at the University of Chicago and her efforts to promote the Amuq Valley excavation in southeastern Turkey as part of the Friends of the Amuq Valley Regional Project.

ATAA Delegation Visits Turkey and Bulgaria

The annual ATAA delegation to Ankara and Bulgaria took place prior to the November 3 2002 elections on June 10-23 2002.

The Ankara part of the visit began with the traditional wreath laying ceremony at the tomb of modern Turkey's founder, Mustafa Kemal Atatürk.

After the ceremony, the delegation made its way to the Presidential Palace where it was received by President Ahmet Necdet Sezer. President Sezer expressed his gratitude for the visit, and said that he truly valued what the Turkish American community was doing to promote Turkey in the US and he always looked forward to meeting with the ATAA to exchange ideas.

The delegation then met with State Minister Şükrü Sina Gürel and the press. Dr. Gürel indicated that the Turkish American community, under the leadership of ATAA, plays an important role in representing Turkey's interests in the US.

At the next meeting with US Ambassador Robert Pearson and Mrs. Pearson, the delegation was shown a power point presentation on Turkish-American relations and Turkey. Ambassador Pearson indicated that the US truly appreciates her relations with Turkey, and values the contribution it is making in the war against terror.

The next day, meetings were held with the Undersecretary of the Foreign Ministry, Ambassador Uğur Ziyal, former Turkish Ambassador to the US, Ambassador Baki İlkin, who hosted a luncheon in ATAA's honor at the Ankara Palace, and Interior Minister Rüştü Kazım Yücelen.

On Wednesday morning, the group met with the Turkish Grand National Assembly's Speaker, Mr. Ömer Izgi., members of the Foreign Affairs Committee headed by Mr. Kamran Inan and several members of the TGNA and members of the Turkish-USA Interparliamentary Friendship Group.

The delegation held further meetings leaders of parties represented in the Turkish parliament, including, Saadet party leader Mr. Recai Kutan, AKP party leader Mr. Tayyip Erdoğan, DYP party leader Dr. Tansu Çiller and MHP leader and Deputy Prime Minister Mr. Devlet Bahçeli. Mr. Bahçeli talked about Turkey's role in the fight against global terrorism, Turkey's leadership of the peacekeeping force in Afghanistan, and the political and economic situation in Turkey.



The Ankara part of the delegation program ended with a visit to the Secretariat General of the National Security Council. General Tuncer Kılıç, Secretary General of the NSC, briefed the group on a variety of issues, including Armenian genocide allegations, Turco-Greek relations and Cyprus.

The visit to Ankara had ended June 13th and was then followed by a visit to Bulgaria, a country whose 10% of the population are ethnic Turks.

The first meeting the group held was with the Movement for Rights and Freedom officials whose party is the coalition partner with the party formed by former King Simeon II. The Movement for Rights and Freedom Party led by Mr. Ahmed Doğan has as its members ethnic Turks, Muslims, Bulgarians, Romas and Jews.

Monday, June 17th began with a briefing at the American Center in Sofia and was then followed by briefing Turkish by Ambassador Haydar Berk who discussed the political progress of the Turkish ethnic minority.

That day's luncheon was hosted by newly appointed American Ambassador James W. Pardew, followed by an afternoon of meetings beginning with Mr. Ivan Petkov, Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs. Mr. Petkov as well as representatives of the Americas and Europe Directorate emphasized the strong relationship between Bulgaria and the U.S., particularly as anti-terrorism coalition partners. Tuesday, June 18th included meetings with State Minister Nezhdet Mallov and Mr. Nik Marinov. Chief Mufti Selim Mehmed , Mr. Stanimer Ilchev, Chairman of the Foreign Policy and with Mr. Ünal Lütfi, Deputy Speaker of the National Assembly.

The next several days, June 19-23, were spent visiting major cities such as Veliko Turnovo, Russe, Razgrad, Shoumen, Varna, Nessebur and Burgas. The delegation met with local officials and members of the Turkish minority and visited historic and cultural sites, many of importance to Turkish cultural and historical heritage.
