ATAA President's Message

In this day and age the strength of nations is measured not by their military might or arsenals, but by their dedication to democracy and individual freedoms.

In this context, free and independent media, and independent non-governmental organizations such as ATAA play important and historic roles. ATAA, as the umbrella organization of fifty-four Turkish-American organizations in the U.S., two in Canada, and one in Turkey, is proud to be a strong player in the Unites States, Turkey, and even in the Turkic world.

It is organizations such as us who must stand up for the common good of our societies. It is us who must bring clarification to misconceptions. It is us who must speak the truth; the truth about not only what we perceive to be unfair in this country, but also as representatives of an ethnic group, the truth about Turkish American relations, and developments in Turkey, all the while however never forgetting to give credit when and where it's due, and express thanks to those who do right by their people. Accomplishing the above task however requires the responsibility, accountability and dignity of the organizations in question.

I declare to you that ATAA embodies in itself all of these qualities. We are an independent, responsible, accountable, democratic, transparent, and inclusive organization which deserves the trust of our home, the United States of America, and also the future increased support of our members and friends. As a direct result of implementing such correct organizational principles, ATAA has been the focus of positive attention from various circles. I for instance have been invited to Europe to speak with other Turkish entities and NGOs and share with them our ideas of how not only just to survive, but also how better to integrate with the societies in which we live, how better to create a better positive change in our new homes for ourselves and our countrymen, and how best to improve the Turkish image.

Turkish American relations went through a difficult period in 2003. However, we see this period not as a future obstacle in the bilateral relations but a hurdle which has already been overcome. Turkish Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan's current and timely visit just happens to validate this observation. America and Turkey, as always in the past, should continue working hand in hand, shoulder to shoulder, for much depends in the region and the world on the Turkish-US friendship and alliance.

Although during our annual ATAA Delegation Visit to Turkey last June we became an expressive channel through which both sides improved communications, should there ever be another undesirable occasion in the future when misunderstandings or lack of communication will strain the relationship and when common good will be overlooked by both sides, ATAA will be more assertive than ever to insure that common sense prevails sooner than later. And today, this particular additional point seems to make the importance of ATAA even clearer. We are a

hardworking, crystal clear and dependable channel for the good of both sides.

We, as Turks living around the globe, are a rather interesting ethnic group at least in an anthropological sense. The Turks for instance happen to inhabit a larger area on earth than any other ethnic group, therefore in one form or another, Turkish language is spoken in more parts of the world than any other language. There is no other ethnic-cultural group with more diverse physical attributes speaking the same language than the Turks. From Finland to China, with the most identifiable physical differences, one will still find Turks speaking Turkish.

I believe as Turkish-Americans living in this country, and as ATAA, we have a historical duty and an unusual opportunity to be a facilitator for the Turkish world. This opportunity is unusual but very fortunate because countless representatives of the Turkish world happened to have met one another in this county, therefore giving another meaning for us Turks to the phrases "The Melting Pot" or "The Mixed Salad". As Turks, we must take advantage of this opportunity, and hug one another here first, and then perhaps export it to the parts of the world where it is not being given a priority. Such a concentration in America is bound to create a new focus on this concept in many parts of the Turkish world.

Again, in a sense, strong organizations such as ATAA, due to their location in America, has an opportunity and a duty to either introduce or emphasize the merits of not only the Turkicness, the sense of "being a Turk" and the Turkic solidarity but also something else that is equally important: Democracy, and the integral part the non-governmental organizations play in it.

Last year we've made a decision to highlight a Turkic country in every ATAA convention. As we approached Azerbaijan in 2003 for the 2004 ATAA Convention, I was overwhelmed with their

outpouring reciprocation to our warm feelings and intentions. I am indebted to the Azerbaijanis for their enormous support of this year's ATAA Convention. I am also pleased to host many Azerbaijani-Americans here in Washington, D.C.

Once again, welcome to all, thank you very much for coming.

ATAA was co-founded by the American Turkish Association of Washington and the Maryland American Turkish Association in an effort to create a national organization representing the Turkish American community. The first meeting of the ATAA General Assembly was held in May of 1980 in Washington. Delegates from 26 organizations participated and created a coordination committee to write the constitution and bylaws. The bylaws of ATAA were ratified on November 16, 1980 and the first board of ATAA elected.

From this nucleus, the Assembly has grown into an organization that represents 54 Turkish American organizations in the United States, Canada and Turkey. Today, the Assembly is an influential and fast growing civic organization that pursues the interests of Turkish Americans and friends of Turkey in Washington and beyond, as well as contributes to the strengthening of relations between the United States and Turkey.

Associations (ATAA) is to unite to the fast growing community of **Turkish** Americans, friends of Turkey and their associations throughout the **United States**; preserve and protect the identity of the Turkish American community and build bridges between the American and Turkish people.

A growing base of individual ATAA members support the work of the Assembly through dues and donations. Financial assistance to the operations of ATAA is also granted from the ATAA Endowment Fund established to secure the long-term growth of the organization.

To fulfill its mission and objectives, ATAA undertakes a number of activities, such as educational seminars for Turkish American communities on grassroots advocacy and civic leadership; conferences on contemporary political, social and economic issues related to Turkey and US-Turkish relations; and cultural events to promote Turkey's rich traditions, art and heritage. Working as an information clearinghouse, ATAA regularly publishes reference material on issues that concern the Turkish American community. The Assembly is also the publisher of a bi-monthly magazine, The Turkish World. ATAA hosts one of the most dynamic website on Turkey and maintains an extensive E-mail communication network. H.E. Hafiz M. Pashayev

Hafiz Pashayev is the first ambassador of Azerbaijan to the United States. He arrived in Washington, D.C., in February 1993, presented his credentials to President Clinton on April 14.

Since assuming his post, Ambassador Pashayev has concentrated mainly on the imperative necessity to develop, broaden, and enhance bilateral US-Azerbaijan relations. This relationship is proving allaround fruitful, especially in the economic field, with Azerbaijan and the US companies engaged into active cooperation in the Caspian energy development. Interaction on the political issues is also becoming more and more intensive, including wide range of security and other matters.

During the initial period of bilateral relations the task of educating American public and academic circles figured prominently in the Ambassador's job description. Educating American lawmakers presented special challenge in the context of the ongoing Armenia – Azerbaijan conflict. The Ambassador has done much to secure foreign assistance in overcoming humanitarian crisis in Azerbaijan, with its 1 million refugees and the displaced, many of whom still have no housing, adequate food or clothing.

Ambassador Pashayev has been instrumental in presenting in the US Azerbaijan's history, culture, and arts, as well as the nation's significant achievements on the path of reforms aimed at establishing free market economy in a democratic society under a rule of law.

In his capacity of Azerbaijan's non-resident Ambassador to Canada (since December 3, 1998) and Mexico (since June 21, 1999), as well as of Ambassador – Permanent Observer to the OAS since April 5, 2001, Dr. Pashayev has done his best to promote Azerbaijan's economic, political, and cultural ties with the countries of North and South America.

Prior to his appointment, Dr. Pashayev served as director of the Metal Physics Laboratory in the Institute of Physics at the Azerbaijani Academy of Sciences in Baku and taught physics at Baku State University.

In 1984 he was named full professor at the Academy of Sciences of Azerbaijan. He received his Ph.D. in theoretical physics in 1971, having pursued postgraduate studies at the Kurchatov Institute of Atomic Energy in Moscow. From 1975 to 1976, he undertook a one-year research at the University of California at Irvine. He graduated from Baku State University in 1963 with a degree in physics. He is the author of more than 120 books and articles, including those published in The New York Times, The Washington Post, The Washington Times, The Christian Science Monitor, The Boston Globe, etc.

Dr. Pashayev is married. Mrs. Rena Pashayev is a scholar and professor of Arabic literature and history. They have two children and four grand-children.

Dr. Nejat Veziroğlu

Dr. Veziroğlu graduated from the City and Guilds College, the Imperial College of Science and Technology, University of London, with degrees in Mechanical Engireering (A.C.G.I., B.Sc.), Advanced Studies in Engineering (D.I.C.) and Heat Transfer (Ph.D.).

In 1962, after serving in some Turkish government agencies and then heading a private company, he joined the University of Miami Engineering Faculty. In 1965, he became the Director of Graduate Studies, Mechanical Engineering, and two years later initiated the first Ph.D. Program in the School of Engineering and Architecture. He served as Chairman of the Department of Mechanical Engineering, 1971 through 1975, and was the Associate Dean for Research of the School of Engineering and Architecture, 1975 through 1979. At present, he is the director if the Clean Energy Research

Institute at the University of Miami, which acts as the focal point of energy and environment related research and information dissemination activities.

Dr. Veziroğlu teaches Heat Transfer, Mass Transfer, Hydrogen Energy and Nuclear Engineering. He has published some 200 scientific reports and papers, and is the editor-in-chief of the International Journal of Hydrogen Energy and International Journal of Energy Environment Economics. He has been an invited lecturer and/or consultant on energy research and education to many countries, including U.S.S.R, Republic of China, India, Pakistan, Japan, Canada, Germany, England, France, Italy, Switzerland, Turkey, Egypt, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait,

the Philippines, Brazil, Argentina, Venezuela and Colombia.

In recognition of the high quality of his research, Dr. Veziroglu has been the recipient of several international awards. He was presented the Turkish Presidential Science Award in 1974, made an Honorary Professor in Xian Jiatong University of China in 1981, and awarded the I. V. Kurchatov Medal by the Kurchatov Institute of Atomic Energy of U.S.S.R in 1982 and Energy for Mankind Award by the Global Energy Society in 1986.

She was featured in the Turkish daily Sabah, recently organized and presented a program on the topic with the Smithsonian Associates, and was quoted in the December issue of the National Geographic.

Zeyno Baran

Zeyno Baran is Director of International Security and Energy Programs at the Nixon Center. She joined the Center in January 2003 and established the Eurasia and Turkey Projects to help American policy makers and opinion shapers better understand the region's political, economic and social dynamics. Previously Ms. Baran was Director of the Caucasus Project at the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS). In 1998, she established the Georgia Forum at CSIS, at the time the only such program in the United States that focused exclusively on this strategic country and its relations with the U.S. and Russia.

Ms. Baran has also worked on Caspian oil and gas pipeline projects since 1996, and frequently travels to the region. In recognition of her prominent contribution to the development of the Baku-Tbilisi-Ceyhan oil pipeline and the South Caucasus gas pipeline projects, in May 2003 she was awarded with the Order of Honor by former Georgian President Eduard Shevardnadze.

In 2001 she was selected as a member of a Greek-Turkish working group striving to improve bilateral relations. While she was born in Turkey, Ms. Baran spent a significant part of her childhood growing up in Greece, giving her a unique perspective on bilateral issues.

Ms. Baran received her M.A. in international economic development and her B.A. in political science from Stanford University. Her work on the compatibility of Islam and democracy received the Firestone Medal for Stanford's most outstanding political science/international relations honors thesis in 1996.

Osman Bengür

Osman Bengür was born in Montgomery County, Maryland 1949. Following his graduation from Princeton in 1971 where he received his B.A in English, he was appointed as Special Assistant to the Commissioner of the Department of Youth Services in Massachusetts. His accomplishments in working with disadvantaged children lead to his role in helping reform foster care in the Department of Children and

Family Services in Illinois. In 1975, he went on to earn a graduate degree in Criminology from University of Cambridge in England. In 1978 Mr. Bengür participated in then Attorney General Joseph Brennan's successful campaign for Governor. In 1979, Oz joined Gov. Brennan's staff as a Special Assistant and liaison to the state Departments of Corrections and Business Regulation and state housing finance authority. In 1980, he was elected a delegate to the Democratic National. He returned to Baltimore in 1983 to join Alex Brown & Sons (now Deutsche Bank), serving as a successful investment banker. In this position, he became an expert in local and state finances. In 1991, he co-found Bengur Bryan & Co., a firm that provides financial advice to mid-sized companies for mergers, acquisitions, and raising capital. In 2002 Oz Bengür ran for Congress in Maryland's 2nd district. He is married with three children.

Zekeriya Beyaz

He subsequently worked on European and Russian affairs at the State Department during 1991-1995. Mr. Bryza served at the U.S. Embassy in Moscow during 1995-1997, first as special assistant to Ambassador Thomas Pickering, then as a political officer covering the Russian Duma, the Communist Party, and the Republic of Dagestan in the North Caucasus. During 1997-1998, Mr. Bryza was Special Advisor to Ambassador Richard Morningstar, coordinating U.S. Government assistance programs on economic reform in the Caucasus and Central Asia. Mr. Bryza then served as the deputy to the Special Advisor to the President and Secretary of State on Caspian Basin Energy Diplomacy from July 1998 to March 2001. In this capacity, Mr. Bryza coordinated the U.S. Government's interagency effort to develop a network of oil and gas pipelines in the Caspian region.

Mr. Bryza graduated from Stanford University with a bachelor's degree in international relations. He received his master's degree in the same field from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy. He is fluent in Russian and Polish, and also speaks German and Spanish.

Tayyibe Gülek-Domaç

Tayyibe Gülek-Domaç served as a Member of Parliament in the 21st term of the Turkish Grand National Assembly representing the constituency of Adana from 1999 to 2002. (Her chief areas of interest are agricultural policy, economics and foreign relations.) During her term in Office, she was a member of the Turkish Delegation to the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe where she was Vice Chair of the Committee on Human Rights, and a member of the Committee on Equality between Men and Women. She served as the Minister of State Responsible for Cyprus in 2002. Prior to her term in office, she worked at the Prime Ministry as Advisor to the Chief Coordinator for Economic Policy of the Prime Minister.

She received her B.A. in Economics with honors from Harvard University in 1991 and her Master's Degree with honors from the London School of Economics. She speaks English and French fluently and has a working knowledge of Spanish.

Ambassador Eric Edelman

Ambassador Eric Edelman has been the United States' ambassador to the Republic of Turkey since July 2003. From February 2001 to June 2003, he was Principal Deputy Assistant to the Vice President for National Security Affairs. Prior to being assigned to the Office of the Vice President, he was Ambassador to the Republic of Finland, 1998-2001. From June 1996 to July 1998, he served as Executive Assistant to the Deputy Secretary of State. Mr. Edelman was Deputy Chief of Mission at the U.S. Embassy, Prague, Czech Republic, from June 1994 to June 1996.

From April 1993 to July 1993, he served as Deputy to the Ambassador-at-Large and Special Advisor to the Secretary of State on the New Independent States. Mr. Edelman's areas of responsibility were defense, security, and space issues. Mr. Edelman served as Assistant Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Soviet and East European Affairs in the Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD) from April 1990 to April 1993.

From April 1989 to March 1990, he was Special Assistant (European Affairs) to the Under Secretary of State for Political Affairs. Mr. Edelman served at the U.S. Embassy in Moscow 1987-89, where he was head of the external political section. He had responsibility for Soviet policies in the third world in the Office of Soviet Affairs at the Department of State from 1984 to 1986.

Previously, Mr. Edelman served as Special Assistant to Secretary of State George P. Shultz, 1982-84; a staff officer on the Secretariat Staff, 1982; a watch officer in the State Department Operations Center 1981-82; and a member of the U.S. Middle East Delegation to the West Bank/Gaza Autonomy Talks Delegations, 1980-81.

A career Foreign Service Officer, Mr. Edelman entered the Senior Foreign Service in 1992. He is a recipient of the Secretary of Defense's award for Distinguished Civilian Service (1993) and the State Department's Superior Honor Award (1990 and 1996).

Mr. Edelman received a B.A. in History and Government from Cornell University in 1972, and a Ph.D. in U.S. Diplomatic History from Yale University in 1981.

Günay Evinch (Övünç)

Günay Evinch received his B.A. in Development Economics and Political Science - Public Service from University of California, Davis.in 1986, and Juris Doctor Degree from Washington & Lee University, Virginia . During 1991-1993 he was a U.S. Fulbright Scholar and Sasakawa Scholar in human rights, counter-insurgency, anti-terrorism, and Armenian allegation of genocide. Since 1993 he is an Attorney at Saltzman & Evinch. He served as a Criminal Prosecution, San Francisco District Attorney; Criminal Defense and Sacramento Federal Public Defender.

Günay Evinch is a second generation Turkish-American. He was ATAA's Secretary General during 1998-2000. He serves private and public entities, such as the Turkish Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Turkish

General Staff, and several Turkish American NGOs, including the American Turkish Veterans Association (ATVA), Turkish Recreational and Cultural Organization (TURCO), Atatürk Society of America (ASA), ARI Foundation, and Anatolia Soccer Club.

Thomas Goltz

Thomas Goltz graduated with an M.A. in Middle Eastern studies from New York University in 1983, with a focus on Arabic and Turkish. For the past decade he was a writer and videographer who specializes in the Caucasus area of the former Soviet Union (Azerbaijan, Armenia, Georgia and Chechnya). His employers have ranged from the Washington Post and the New York Times, US News and World Report, Forbes Electronic Mailbox, Businessweek and The Nation. He also collaborates with the LA Times, National Geographic News Service, Pacific News Service, the London Sunday Times and other publications.

Mr. Goltz has produced and filmed several documentary pieces for BBC TV (on Chechnya and Abkhazia) and acted as a consultant or cameraman for other television stations, such as ABC Nightline and CBS 60 Minutes, appearing on the latter's program on Caspian Oil in 1999. His first film on Chechnya took second in the annual (London) Rory Peck Awards in 1996.

He has also written a number of scholarly articles on developments in the Caucasus region for Foreign Policy, The National Interest and The Washington Quarterly. His book on Azerbaijan—Azerbaijan Diary: A Rogue Reporter's Adventures in an Oil-rich, War-torn, Post-Soviet Republic (M.E. Sharpe, 1998)—has been declared essential reading on the entire post-Soviet region by reviewers as diverse as the Wall Street Journal and Brill's Content and is now used as a classroom text in various American universities.

He lectures widely on a self-created circuit that includes visits to such institutions as Berkeley, Princeton, Harvard, Columbia and other leading universities, as well as regional chapters of the World Affairs Council and the American Committees on Foreign Relations.

George S. Harris

George S. Harris received his Ph.D. in History of the Middle East from Harvard University in 1957. He then served at the American Embassy in Ankara until 1962, when he returned to Washington for various assignments dealing with the Middle East. In 1977 he became Director of Analysis for Western Europe in INR in the Department of State, and in 1979 he was made Director of Analysis for Near East and South Asia, a post which he occupied until his retirement from the Department of State at the end of December 1995. In addition to his government career, he was a Professorial Lecturer at the School for Advanced International Studies of The Johns Hopkins University from 1968 to 1981 and he gave occasional courses at The George Washington University. He has written many articles and a number of books on Turkey including The Origins of Communism in Turkey (1967), Troubled Alliance: Turkish American problems in Historical Perspective (1972), Turkey: Copping with Crisis (1985), and The Communists and the Kadro Movement: Shaping Ideology in Ataturk's Turkey (2002).

Ali Hasanov

Ali Hasanov graduated from the department of history of Baku State University in 1985 and later from Moscow State University in 1988. He become the postgraduate student of the same university and defended a thesis in 1992. During 1992-1995, he worked at New Azerbaijan Party as the head of department. Since 1995 he has worked at President Administration as the head of social-political department.

Mr. Hasanov is the doctor of historic sciences, professor, and author of seven books and of more than hundred scientific works. He is the chief of the "Foreign Policy and International Relations" chair in the Academy of Public Administration under the

President of the Republic of Azerbaijan, and a member of the board of the New Azerbaijan Party.

He is married and has two children.

Rafael Huseynov

Rafael Huseynov was born in 1954 in Kurdemir. He entered Baku State University at chair of "Persian philology" of the Oriental Studies Department in 1971. After graduating in 1976, he attended the Institute of Philosophy and Law of the Academy of Sciences of the Republic of Azerbaijan and become the postgraduate student of the Institute of "People of Middle East." He defended a thesis and got the degree of scientist in 1980. He was a correspondent of "Voice of America" radio of USA in Azerbaijan between from 1993 to 2000. During 1987-1989 he continued his pedagogical activity at the Azerbaijan State University teaching Persian literature, and taught "History of Culture" at Azerbaijan State Conservatory after Uzeyir Hacibeyov in 1990-1991. He prepared special programs about Azerbaijan literature, Azerbaijan culture and taught this subjects at "Xazar" University in 1995. He was a chief of the Azerbaijan Literature Museum of Academy of Sciences of Republic of Azerbaijan after Nizami Genjevi in 2003.

Rafael Huseynov is the author of more than 60 scientific investigations. Also in periodical printing he has published about 100 materials about issues concerning Azerbaijan literature. For the last 20 years he is the host on weekly show at the State Radio "Evening meetings." He is the author of movies about Huseyn Javid, poets A. Bakir and H. Huseynov. He has been awarded by the Academy of Sciences, Azerbaijan University and Writers Union for his book dedicated to Huseyn Cavid.

Nazim İbrahimov

Nazim İbrahimov graduated from Azerbaijan Polytechnic Institute after the name of Ch. Ildirim in Baku, and earned specialty of engineer-mechanic over the machine building.

In 1997-2000 he worked as an Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary Ambassador of Azerbaijan Republic in Ukraine. In 2000-2002 he was a member of the Milli Mejlis (National Parliament) of Azerbaijan Republic and was the substitute member of the Permanent Delegation of PACE.

Since August 2002, he has been the Chairman of the State Committee of Azerbaijan Republic on Affairs with Azerbaijanians Living in Foreign Countries.

Sedat İşçi

Sedat İşçi, is a senior lecturer in English at Ege University. He specializes on British and American culture and cultural studies theories. He conducted research on cultural aspects of Turkish-American relations and foundations of American foreign policy and lectured on Turkish culture in the U.S. in 1999-2000. He is the Project and Research Director of The First Turkish Immigrants in America: 1860-1924 project and Coordinator of Turkish-Armenian Relations Studies Group.

Günseli Sönmez İşci

Günseli Sönmez İşci is a professor of English in the Department of English at Ege University. She specializes and publishes on Shakespeare and critical theories. She is the author of Macbeth from New Criticism to New Historicism (2001). With a Fulbright senior award she conducted research and taught at Temple University, Philadelphia, U.S.A. in 1999-2000. She is one of the initiators and organizers of an Annual International Cultural Studies Symposium held at Ege University. Currently she is the Head of the English Department at Ege University. She is the founder and the Director of Women's Studies Graduate Program at the Social Sciences Institute of Ege University. She is also Project Editor of The First Turkish Immigrants in America project.

Attila Karaosmanoğlu

Dr. Attila Karaosmanoğlu is an economist by profession. He was educated at the University of Ankara and Istanbul. He was a visiting scholar at Harvard and Exchange Faculty. He is a member of NYU's Faculty.

He also attended Ankara and Middle East Technical Universities between 1954-63. In his professional life,he was Head of the Economic Planning Department of the State Planning Org. of Turkey, Adviser to the Federation of Turkish Trade Unions, Consultant to the Turkish Scientific and Tech. Research Council, Senior Consultant Directorate for Scientific Affairs OECD, an Economist at the World Bank, Deputy Prime Minister of Turkey in 1971 in charge of Economic Affairs and Chairman of the High Planning Council. He has also been the World Bank's Chief Economist for European, Middle East, and North Africa Region, Director of Europe, Middle East and North Africa Region Country Programs, Vice President East Asia and Pacific Regions, Vice President of the Asia Region and between 1991-1994 he was appointed as the Managing Director of the World Bank. Presently he is a Board Member of the Turkish Scientific and Technical. Research Council. His Publications include Towards Full Employment and Price Stability (OECD Pub. with others) 1977, Poverty and Prosperity- The two Realities of Asian Development (World Bank Pub.) 1989; Diversity and Consensus- The Emergence of an Asian Development Paradigm (World Bank Pub) 1991, 21. Yüz Yılda Planlama (State Planning Org. of Turkey) 2000. Türkiyede YenidenYap1ılanma ile ilgili Sorunlar (Turkish Acad. of Sciences Pub.) 2002) and several articles.

Ercüment Kılıç

Mr. Kılıç was born in 1958 in Ankara. He is a graduate of UT-Austin with a BS in Economics and International Politics. He has served numerous times as President of TURANT and as VP of ATAA. Among his accomplishments is his involvement and arrangement of Congressman Jim Moody's trip as the first US Congressman in history to visit Azerbaijan. Due to his formal training in performing arts, he has been a cultural ambassador for Turkey since 1977. He has been invited by various organizations to do seminars and workshops on Turkic cultures in all 50 states in the US and in England, Germany, Holland, Switzerland, the Republic of China, Hong Kong, and Japan.

Timur Kocaoglu

Timur Kocaoglu, B.A. (1971) from Istanbul University; M.A. (1976) & Ph.D (1982) from Columbia University (New York). Having worked as a research analyst and a Program Supervisor at Radio Free Europe/Radio Liberty (1977-1994 in Munich, Germany) and as a faculty member at Marmara University (1985-1988, in Istanbul), Dr. Kocaoglu has been teaching Turkic languages, history of the Turkic peoples, and Modern Central Asia & Azerbaijan at Koc University in Istanbul since 1994.

He has published numerous articles on the language, literature, cultural history, and current political affairs of the Turkic peoples in Caucasus, Crimea, Volga-Ural region, Central Asia, Siberia, East Turkistan (China) and Afghanistan. His publications include the following books: Turkish World Phrase Guide for Travelers (Istanbul: Türk Dünyası Araştırmaları Vakfı, 1992); Reform Movements and Revolutions in Turkistan: 1900-1924 (Haarlem, Netherlands: SOTA, 2001). Currently he is working on a book on the republics of Central Asia & Azerbaijan to be published by Michigan State University.

Veli Küçük

He was born in 1944 in a Türkmen village of Bilecik Province. He completed the primary school in his village and middle school in Gölpazarı. He continued on to Kuleli Military High School 1959, where he graduated in 1963.

After graduating from the Military College in 1965, he served as an officer and then commander. His 35 year career encompassed many duty stations, among them Edirne, Van, Eskişehir, Ağrı and Kocaeli Province Gendarmeire Regiment Commanders.

He was promoted to Staff General in 1996. He completed the Giresun Region Regiment and commanded the troops there for two years. Later, while the Commander of Çanakkale Brigade, he moved the Brigade to Bilecik Province. He began his military

service in 1966 as a Lieutenant and retired in 2000 as a General.

He is married with a daughter and a grandson. He continues to work, now in the private sector as a manager. In addition to his work, he volunteers for the Foundation for Research on Turkish World. Justin McCarthy

Justin McCarthy received a Ph.D. in Near Eastern history from UCLA in 1978 and a Certificate in Demography from Princeton University in 1980. He is presently Distinguished Professor of Arts and Sciences at the University of Louisville, where he also served as Chairman of the Department of History from 1986 to 1992. He has been a Visiting Fellow at Princeton University, the School of Oriental and African Studies of the University of London, and BoËaziçi University in İstanbul. From 1967 to 1969 he taught at Middle East Technical University in Ankara as a US Peace Corps Volunteer. Professor McCarthy specializes in the social and demographic history of the modern Middle East. He frequently addresses academic and public audiences in the United States, Europe, and Middle East. Professor McCarthy has been voted a Corresponding Member of the Turkish Historical Association. He has received the Chairman's Education Award from the Turkish-American Friendship Council and awards from Turkish-American organizations. In 1985 he received an honorary doctorate from Boğaziçi University. He has held a Senior Research Fellowship from the National Needs Postdoctoral Fellowship from the

National Science Foundation, a Fulbright-Hays fellowship, and other fellowships and grants.

Jayhun Mollazade

Jayhun Mollazade, Ph.D. Graduated from Baku University' School of Middle Eastern Studies in 1983. He joined the Institute of Philosophy and Law, a think tank in Baku under the academy of science where he completed his Ph.D. in Arabic political philosophy. In 1992, he was sent to Washington DC to build the Embassy of Azerbaijan and served as chargee d'affaires until 1993. B. Lynn Pascoe

B. Lynn Pascoe took up his duties as Deputy Assistant Secretary in the Bureau of European and Eurasian Affairs on September 4, 2001. His areas of responsibility include countries in the Eastern Mediterranean, the Caucasus, and Central Asia.

A Career Minister in the Senior Foreign Service, Ambassador Pascoe served most recently as American Ambassador in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. He earlier served as the U.S. Special Negotiator for Nagorno-Karabakh and Regional Conflicts and the U.S. Co-Chair of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe's (OSCE) Minsk Group.

From 1993 to 1996, Mr. Pascoe was the Director of the American Institute in Taiwan, the organization that carries out cultural, commercial and other relations between the people of the United States and the people of Taiwan. Sabri Sayarı

Dr. Sabri Sayarı is the Executive Director of the Institute of Turkish Studies (ITS), a private, non-profit educational institution that promotes scholarly research on Turkey in American universities. He also teaches at Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service where ITS is located.

Prior to his current position, Dr. Sayarı was a Senior Staff Member at the National Academy of Science's National Research Council (1992-1994), Consultant at RAND (1985-92), and Professor of Political Science at Boğaziçi University in İstanbul, Turkey (1974-1984).

Dr. Sayarı holds a B.A. and Ph.D. degrees in economics and political science, respectively, from Columbia University. He has taught at Rutgers University, and held visiting appointments at several institutions including Columbia University, the University of California, Irvine, and Aarhus University in Denmark.

Dr. Sayarı has published extensively on Turkish politics and foreign policy. His recent publications include Turkey's New World: Changing Dynamics in Turkish Foreign Policy, co-editor with Alan Makovsky (2000); Politics, Parties and Elections in Turkey, co-editor with Yılmaz Esmer (2002); and Political Leaders and Democracy in Turkey, co-editor with Metin Heper (2002).

Oktay Sinanoğlu

Prof. Sinanoğlu graduated from Ankara TED College in Turkey in 1953.

He received his B.A. from UCLA, Berkeley in 1956 and his Master's degree from MIT in 1957. Prof. Sinanoglu received Alfred Sloan Prize. He received his PhD in Chemistry from Berkeley in 1959. He was the youngest college professor in Yale in 1962 when he was 26 years old. He was appointed to Professor position in Middle East Technical Institute of Turkey in 1962 and in Yale in 1964.

Prof. Sinanoglu won Germany's Alexander von Humbolt award in 1973.

He received many other awards including Japanese Scientists Award, TUBITAK Science Award, ILESAM Meritorious Service Award, TURKSAV's Service to Turkish World Award and Uğur Mumcu Science Award. He has more than 250 articles and books some translated to world languages. He was nominated to NOBEL prize twice.

John Sitilides

John Sitilides is the Executive Director of the Western Policy Center, a public policy organization promoting U.S. geostrategic interests and Western institutions in southeastern Europe, emphasizing Greek-Turkish security cooperation and Balkan political and economic integration into Western and international frameworks.

Mr. Sitilides founded the Center in Washington, D.C. in 1998, and directs all aspects of strategic planning, policy analysis, public affairs programming, publications, government and corporate relations, financial

development, and media communications at the Center.

Mr. Sitilides has twice been awarded by the Department of State for his expertise on the American Foreign Policy Process, and has testified before Congress on U.S. foreign policy in the eastern Mediterranean. He received his M.A. from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and spent a semester at the Hebrew University, Israel (1990) and received his Ph.D. from University of Wisconsin-Madison, 1998 in political science. His books include Islamic Political Identity in Turkey (Oxford University Press, 2003); with John Esposito, Turkish Islam and the Secular State: The Gülen Movement (Syracuse University Press, 2003).

Mr. Yavuz also carried out an extensive fieldwork in Fergana Valley, Uzbekistan to examine the relationship between Islam and nationalism and the preservation and dissemination of Islamic knowledge under socialism. He is an author of more than 30 articles on Islam, nationalism, Kurdish question, and modern Turkish politics. He published in Comparative Politics, Critique, SAIS Review, Journal of Muslim Minority Affairs, Central Asian Survey, Journal of Islamic Studies, and Journal of Palestine Studies.

Some of his articles are translated into Arabic and Bosnian from English. He is a regular contributor to several Turkish newspapers and magazines and an editorial member of Critique, and Journal of Muslim Minority Affairs.

Turan Yazgan

Prof. Dr. Turan Yazgan was born in 1938 in Egridir, Isparta. He successfully completed Kastamonu High School in 1955. His education continued at Istanbul University, where he received a degree in economics in 1959.

Mr Yazgan begain his career at the Ministry of Public Works and Settlement Directorate of Planning, first as an Economist then as the "Regional Planner" for five years.

He left the Ministry in 1963, to continue his education Italy. His graduate work focused on the Regional Development of Southern Italy. He submitted his dissertation on "Urbanization of Turkish Workforce and its Demographic and Socio-economic Characteristics". He became an associate professor with his research on "Social Security and Revenue Distribution".

During 1977 and 1978, Mr. Yazgan served as the Development Coordinator of South-East Anatolian Project. He presented the project on the Development of South Anatolian Region to the State Department's Reform Agriculture Division.

In 1979, he became a full-time professor at Istanbul University Business Administration and Economics Department, where he also served on the University Board of Directors.

In 2000, Mr Yazgan resigned his university posts to become President of "Turkish World Research Foundation." By founding the Voices from Turkish World Chorus, he helped introduce Turkish music to the world. He hosted many Turkish artists from throughout the diaspora and held many art exhibits and plays featuring these artists. He initiated the Turkish World Children's Festival and also the Turkish Women's Congress. He has published almost 100 magazines about Turkish World. He has founded high schools and colleges taught in the languages of Turkic Republics.

He has been awarded more than 200 awards for his contribution to Turkish World. He has received the title of Honorary Professor from many universities in Turkey.

Mr. Yazgan is married and a father of three sons and grandfather of two.

ATAA 7th Annual Delegation Visit To Turkey

WHAT MESSAGE DID ATAA TAKE TO TURKEY THIS YEAR?

Our message this year was simple. We lectured no leader in Turkey on Turkish internal or external politics and we told everyone, we were in Turkey this year, because:

- 1. ATAA would like to be self sufficient with finances received only from membership, and private enterprise. In this sense, ATAA takes the first courageous steps, and hopes that all other associations abroad follows suit. This is essential for any successful grassroots lobbying effort anywhere in the world. Turkish associations must be independent to receive respect in those societies.
- 2. ATAA is independent, unbiased, free of all internal politics in Turkey, and politically aligned with no one. ATAA is open to Turkish people from a variety of backgrounds: economically, educationally, politically, and ideologically. This is also essential, because there is power in numbers, and to gain the numbers, we must concentrate on commonalities, not differences among ourselves.
- 3. Turkish lobbying efforts abroad by Turkish associations must be as NGOs acting first for the good of the societies in which they live.

4. Promoting the Turkish image and defending Turkish issues in the U.S. do require a massive PR attack on the part of the Turkish government, and past efforts of accomplishing this task through the expensive lobbying companies have been fruitless.

EXTENSIVE TURKISH MEDIA COVERAGE FOR ATAA

We were front-page headline news in Hürriyet, the daily with the biggest circulation in Turkey. The headline read "The Diaspora's Insurance Game!". It cited our warning message for the past two years to Turkey on the Armenian insurance claims, and warned the leaders. Head writer Mr. Oktay Eksi also had a first page article on the item and stated: "I guess Mr. Ercüment Kiliç doesn't know that in our country some authorities don't have the custom of taking precautionary steps not to have the bus roll over before it does. We usually have the accident, and then take measures."

Milliyet article on a quote I provided, which was received by the ATAA office from an American stating: "How could Turkey do this, I even helped you during your earthquake", received attention by Foreign Relations Committee of Turkish parliament. AKP leadership there was uncomfortable about the article.

However, we explained that this was a ripple effect of what had actually transpired and that we had no intentions on declaring opinion as to why Turkey did what it did.

ATAA visit was also front-page headline news on Turkish Daily News, as well as Milliyet, Yeni Safak, Cumhuriyet, and Radikal.

President-elect of ATAA, Vural Cengiz and I were guests on TV programs on TRT, and Kanal 8. Various other TV stations such as TRT2, TRT International, Star, Samanyolu TV, and NTV also reported on the ATAA visit for a number of days.

HOW WAS THE MESSAGE RECEIVED BY THE GOVERNMENT, OPPOSITION PARTY, AND OTHER PARTIES?

A group of 18 of us visited with the Turkish president Ahmet Necdet Sezer, prime minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan, various cabinet ministers:
Abdullah Gül, Mehmet Aydin, Erkan Mumcu,
Besir Atalay, Kemal Unakitan, the MGK General Secretary Tuncer Kılınç, and the political party leaders Deniz Baykal of CHP, Ali Talip Özdemir of ANAP, Mehmet Agar of DYP, and Cem Uzan of Genç Party.

Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan stated, " I follow your progress with pleasure", and without an exception, everyone we spoke to, applauded ATAA for its direction, including all the members of the Turkish press.

THE PROGRAM IN ISTANBUL WITH TUSIAD:

After the four-day visit in Ankara, we concluded our trip in Istanbul with an open-to-the-press-symposium with TUSIAD, with their leadership, and Ambassador Sukru Elekdag who joined in as a speaker. This was a very successful, well-attended event by the press and Turkish business community.

During the opening speech, following Aldo Koslowski of TUSIAD, I invited all the private sector in Turkey to take a more keen role in image promotion of Turkey abroad, and I invited their corporate financial support for NGOs abroad such as ATAA. President-elect Vural Cengiz, and ATAA member Ahmet Yucel were among the panel speakers, examing Turkish-US relations.





ATAA LEADERSHIP VISITED ERIC EDELMAN, THE NEW AMBASSADOR TO TURKEY

ATAA leadership and membership paid a courtesy visit to Eric Edelman who is expected to be appointed to the U.S. Ambassador position in Turkey by this fall. Mr. Edelman whose parents were immigrants to Turkey in the early part of this century from Russia, certainly seem to make his appointment to the position not only a wise one for the United States, but also a pleasant one for Turkey. His very sincere, approachable and unassuming style will probably be important assets to the further development of the relationship between Turkey and the United States. During the visit ATAA president Ercument Kılıç was accompanied by ATAA Secretary General Özgür Karaosmanoğlu, ATAA Vice President Oya Bain and other ATAA Members, as well as the ATA-DC President Hülya Polat.

President Ercüment Kılıç also stated at the end of the meeting "as ATAA we want to be more visible in the United States and especially in Washington, DC as an NGO and a think tank, presenting a cross section of views of a variety of Turkish-Americans. We will publish annual white papers, and we would like your kind assistance in communicating these views in person to the Vice President and the President", and Mr. Edelman promised an effort to accommodate.


